VAUHTI GRIP POWDER

Vauhti Grip Powder is a high content fluor powder, which contains extremely fine graphite powder. Vauhti Grip Powder is used to cover grip waxes.

Conditions:

Easy to apply onto any kind of grip wax / in all conditions.

How to apply Vauhti Grip Powder:

1. Sprinkle Vauhti Grip Powder on the completely cooled grip wax.
2. Adhere it with cork onto the grip wax. Be careful *not to mix it* with the grip wax.
 - In wet, warm conditions (above zero temperatures) cork with light pressure.
 - In very cold conditions, cork hard enough to fasten Vauhti Grip Powder onto the hard grip wax surface.
 - Use different corks for the grip waxes and Vauhti Grip Powder (new Vauhti white race cork).



Vauhti Grip Powder does not affect the grip - But it improves the glide substantially!

Note: If you mix Vauhti Grip Powder with the grip wax it will reduce the durability of grip waxing .

VAUHTI MF-1 FLUOR POWDER AND MF-2 COMPRESSED FLUOR "Nappi"

Vauhti MF-1 fluor powder and MF-2 compressed fluor (nappi) contain molybdenum powder.

MF-1

From wet conditions to mild -2...-3C conditions.

1. Prep the skis according the conditions, sprinkle MF-1 powder and melt completely with iron
2. Let cool down completely, brush thoroughly with nylon brush.
3. In *suction conditions* brush with horsehair brush.

Instead of ironing you can apply MF-1 powder also with roto cork.

When using roto-cork adhere the powder first with natural hand-cork.



MF-1 contains an additional powder ingredient, which makes it very base-friendly. It also protects the base from over-heating and drying.

Ultra fine molybdenum powder rejects dirt effectively .

MF-2

From zero conditions to -8C.

1. Prep the skis according the conditions, rub MF-2 evenly on the glide zone (apply enough!), roto-cork or iron.
2. When using the iron, set the temperature as low as possible, so that MF-2 just starts to melt. Add another layer of MF-2 and adhere with roto-cork or hand-cork.
3. Let cool down completely and brush thoroughly with nylon brush.



MF-1 and MF-2 are very easy to apply.
